#### SPRING NEIGHBORHOOD CLEAN-UP

The neighborhood association has invested many hours of labor and money from the association and from various grants to landscape the Winchester Road entrance, the Memorial Garden, 2 small "eyebrow" gardens, trees, and knock-out rose bushes at street corners.

We've worked hard to make the neighborhood beautiful and welcoming. Unfortunately, just like your own yard, these areas require maintenance and upkeep.

During these last weeks, a very small group of neighbors have worked extremely hard to trim back most of the knock-out roses, cut bamboo out of the creek, clean the creek, and trim-up Memorial Park. Pat Tatum obtained tools and supplies from the city.

This was definitely a case of a few who gave their all for the good of all of us that live in this neighborhood. We can show our appreciation with words of thanks and by adopting one small patch of the common spaces in our neighborhood to maintain while caring for our own yards. Many hands make light work. These volunteers will appreciate your effort.

# **DOGWOODS REPLACED**

Kentucky in the spring makes you picture Keeneland and dogwood trees. Dogwoods are beautiful flowering pink or white trees. There are 5 species of dogwood trees that are native to Kentucky. Paducah hosts a Moonlight Bloom Walk to see their beautiful dogwood trees. They can be found in open woodlands and fields growing wild throughout KY.

There is a history and a story of how our original dogwood trees were donated to our neighborhood. After a rival Auburn - Alabama football game in 2010, an Alabama fan poured herbicide on two 130-year-old Auburn "sacred" trees where traditionally Auburn fans toilet paper-wrapped and celebrated games.

Later, the Auburn Alumni decided to respond to the dastardly Alabama deed by planting trees in the cities of every SEC campus (i.e. turning the other cheek).

Our neighborhood received dogwood trees because we have Auburn Drive.

Some of our donated dogwood trees have died out, but we have received a Neighborhood Action Matching Program Grant to replace them.

# **NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH**

As Spring turns to Summer, petty vandals see easy opportunities to help themselves to your possessions. There has already been a rash of breaking locks and lock hinges on neighborhood sheds.

- LOCK your vehicles and park under lights. Use your garage if possible. Don't leave purses, wallets, electronics, or valuables in your car.
- Double think gun safety. Don't leave ammo in your gun. Don't leave guns in your vehicle. Don't leave guns laying around your house where children or someone with anger issues have access.
- Shut your garage door. Attached garages
  provide an easy entry into your home. If your car
  is parked in the garage, you might think your
  purse is safe in the car, but not if you don't shut
  the garage door. If you love your new weed
  eater or lawn mower, so will others.
- School is out. Watch for kids who don't watch for themselves. Scooters, skateboards, and darting out after a basketball are types of activities that distract kids from watching for cars.
- Remember, if something looks strange, it is probably not good and should be reported. Be aware of your surroundings, your street, and your neighbors. Keep your head up!

## **BE RESPECTFUL TO YOUR NEIGHBORS**

- When you plan a friend or family gathering, make sure that you don't block other neighbors' driveways.
- Be aware of your music level or your barking dogs' effect on neighbors. They might have a different work schedule, a new baby, or be sick.
- Trash receptacles need to be on the grass not in the street. They need to be taken off the street after emptying as soon as your schedule allows.
- There is a city ordinance that does not allow parking of vehicles in yards.
- If you own a large RV or boat, think about its location from a neighbor's perspective.
- Do you have a vehicle parked in your driveway that hasn't been moved for a very long time?
- We are fortunate to live in a very well-kept neighborhood for 99% of the homes. Take a fresh look at your house and driveway to ensure it is up to the standards of your neighbors.
