NEEDLE EXCHANGE PROGRAM

On September 25, the EPNA hosted a meeting with John Moses of the Health Department to discuss placing a Needle Exchange Mobile Program at the Mini Mart on Anniston Dr.

There was a lot of concern about the proximity to daycares, schools, and parks.

Thank you to everyone who attended and showed your support that this wasn't the correct location for this service. The Health Department has decided not to place the program on Anniston.

The Health Department still sees the need in 40505 area and would like alternate ideas of a location. Please email JohnQ.Moses@lfchd.org with your suggestion of a better location for this service. John listened and responded to our concerns, in return, he asked for feedback on better locations.

NEW SAFETY SIGNS
