NEWSLETTERS

The neighborhood association takes pride that it has been able to deliver newsletters to 760 homes three to five times a year. This is over and above what many neighborhoods do, even those with homeowners associations.

The \$5 dues cover the cost of printing while donations cover all the other things done by the association. But it takes a small army of block captains to do the delivering. Like many places, we are experiencing a labor shortage as block captains move away or are retiring from their volunteering.

After a couple of years of discussions, the board has decided to move to emailing newsletters instead of hand delivering starting in 2023. The newsletter will also be posted on our website.

For this to be successful, we need:

- 1. One email address for your family.
- 2. Share with new neighbors that they can receive a newsletter.
- 3. If you do not use the internet, we need to know you would like to receive a paper copy.

<u>DUES</u>

As you are very aware, \$5 doesn't go very far any more. Again after many discussions, the board has decided to *recommend* a dues increase to \$10 per adult starting in 2023 to be voted on at the Association's October meeting.Over half of the neighbors that pay association dues make a donation for a larger amount. This is what has kept us going for many years. Printing the newsletter takes most of the dues. We pay a monthly electric bill for the lights and holiday decorations at the front entrance. We pay for water used at the front entrance.

In the past few years, we have added new lighting, repaired the walls, refreshed holiday decorations and lights,replaced landscaping and mulch to the front entrance. Rose bushes throughout the neighborhood have been replaced as they die. We hired landscapers to mulch trees, roses, and the memorial garden after skipping mulching during Covid.

We received city monies to invest in a technology program to organize the associations email lists, newsletters, and website. This money will run out.

So to maintain the level of communication and beautification that we want to continue for the betterment of our neighborhood we need to budget for the increases. We hope you understand and think this small investment is worthwhile.

OCTOBER NEIGHBORHOOD MEETING

Our final neighborhood meeting for the year will be held in October. The Tuesday night date will depend on the schedules of the two candidates running for the 6th District Council position. We will host a question-answer session with these candidates. Plan to attend to make your voting decisions instead of relying on the media information.

During the October meeting, elections will be held for the 2023-2024 board for the neighborhood association.

The nominating committee is now accepting candidates for the ballot. There will be several open seats on the board. Please consider serving or nominating a neighbor. There are many people that have much to offer the neighborhood in experiences, expertise, and contacts.

MAYORAL QUESTION / ANSWERS

The Association is partnering with the League of Women Voters and Spectrum to host a question / answer session from the two mayoral candidates: Linda Gorton and David Kloiber in October. This will be open to the public. Watch for more details later.
